Where value can leak from your program

- Waste costs and pricing**
 Review disposal, transportation, rental, fuel surcharge, service, and container costs across vendors and sites.
- Vendors and outlets**
 Assess vendor fragmentation, outlet choices, service consistency, and opportunities to improve coordination or pricing.
- Recovery opportunities**
 Identify streams with potential for recycling, reuse, rebates, landfill diversion, or Alternative Engineered Fuels.
- Internal workflows**
 Look for manual work and rework in quoting, profiling, approvals, scheduling, invoice review, reporting, and billing.
- Compliance and records**
 Review profiles, manifests, bills of lading, approvals, recordkeeping, and related compliance controls.

Built around your operation

The waste audit can be scoped to one facility, selected waste streams, or a broader multi-site program. Wastebits works from the information available (invoices, vendor lists, waste streams, etc.) to identify the opportunities worth deeper action.

YOU MAY BE ASKING

Is a leak audit right for my organization?

A Leak Audit may be a good fit if your waste program spans multiple vendors, facilities, or waste streams; relies heavily on spreadsheets and manual coordination; or lacks a clear view of total cost, recovery value, and compliance risk.

It is especially useful when pricing and service levels vary by site, recycling opportunities may be underused, invoices are difficult to verify, or teams are spending too much time chasing documents, approvals, and vendor updates.

The goal is to bring those issues into one prioritized view so your organization can focus on the changes most likely to reduce cost, recover value, simplify work, and strengthen control.
